Vicar's September Jottings

I'll begin as I ended my comments from last month by inviting anybody to come along to the evening service on September 6th to share how God has spoken to them over the Summer. It may be something simple or profound but my guess is that several of us have encountered God in many ways and it is so good to encourage one another. If you do intend to come and share, it's a real help if you'd tell me beforehand so that I can plan the service.

At our last PCC we suddenly realised how many issues we are facing as a church where we don't know the way forward. So, rather than have our usual Prayer Meeting on 1st September we are holding a half-night of Prayer. There is more information on the notice-sheet but please see if you can come for at least an hour – we say in our values that we want prayer to be central so this is an opportunity to make that real and do business with God.

At the Centenary Service at St Saviour's I reflected on us becoming a church of "yes-and" rather than "yes-but", because while the second puts down the first builds up. The following Saturday someone prayed "Lord, let us be a church of ands not butts". As they prayed these words I heard them differently, "Lord, let us be a church of hands not butts". The addition of one letter to both words signified to me a desire that we'd become a church of people willing to serve rather than people sitting passively.

Just after that prayer meeting I met with Dee who shared a picture that I felt confirmed what I'd just felt. A few weeks earlier while with those praying before morning services, Dee saw a picture of people sat on the ground like young schoolchildren in a Reception Class. Except that they weren't sat listening to a teacher but listening to Jesus. They were very attentive and as he stopped speaking, they all got up immediately and simply began to do what he had just said to them. They got off their butts to use their hands in His service. I offer this as it came to me and, as Jesus would say, those who have ears to hear, let them hear!

Finally, I do hope you're signed up to the Church Weekend. I'm really excited about the opportunities of being 'at home'. I know Chris Neal will bring us encouragement and challenge so its god for as many of us, of all ages, to be involved. Contact Jo in the office if you want to add your name.
